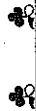

DRAFT RULES

OF THE

Joint Oxford and Cambridge Athletic Club



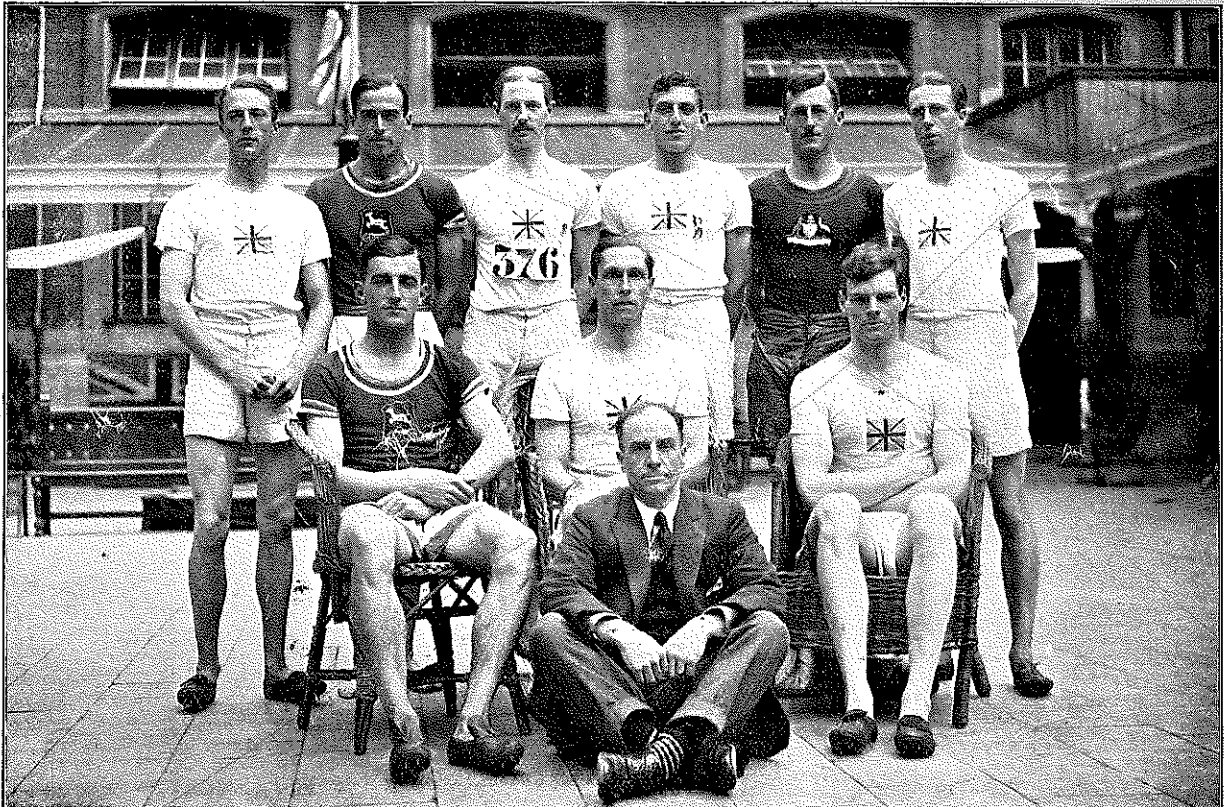
1. The name of the Club shall be the "ACHILLES CLUB."
2. The following shall be eligible as candidates for membership of the Club:
 - (i) All ~~past~~ ^{present and future} Blues and Half-Blues of the O.U.A.C. and C.U.A.C. ^{who shall apply direct to the Committee}
 - (ii) ~~Other~~ members of the O.U.A.C. and C.U.A.C. ~~not to exceed 12 in number from each in any one year, to be nominated by the Committees of the O.U.A.C. and C.U.A.C. respectively.~~
3. There shall be an Annual General Meeting of the members of the Club at least once in every year, to be held as near as possible to the date of the University Sports. ^{Notice of this meeting shall be sent to every member at least 15 days before it is held.}
4. The President and Vice-Presidents of the Club shall be elected by the Annual General Meeting, to hold office for one year.
5. There shall be a General Committee of the Club, who shall be responsible for the conduct of its affairs.

The Committee shall include the Presidents, Treasurers and Secretaries of the O.U.A.C. and C.U.A.C. and not more than six other members, to be elected by the Annual General Meeting and to hold office for one year.
6. The Committee shall have the power to fill any casual vacancies which may occur in its membership in the intervals between Annual General Meetings. The Committee shall have the power to co-opt additional members up to the number of three.
7. The Committee shall appoint a ~~Chairman~~ and an Honorary Treasurer and an Honorary Secretary, ^{and any other officers they shall elect, in any manner they may think fit.}
8. The Committee shall elect the members to the Club from among the eligible candidates.
9. The candidates for membership of the Club shall be divided in two categories:
 - (i) Senior candidates, who shall be those candidates who have gone down from the University prior to the formation of the Club.
 - (ii) Resident candidates who shall be those candidates in residence at the University at the time of, or subsequent to, the formation of the Club.
10. (i) Senior candidates, when elected by the Committee, shall become life members of the Club upon payment of the life subscription of 5 guineas, or if they pay an annual subscription of 1 guinea for seven years.
 - (ii) Resident candidates, when elected by the Committee, shall become members of the Club upon payment of a sum of 2 guineas. They shall pay no further subscription while they remain in residence at the University and shall enjoy the full privileges of the Club, ^{but}
 - (iii) ~~Resident members~~, when they leave the University, shall become life members of the Club upon payment of the sum of 3 guineas, or if they pay an annual subscription of 1 guinea for five years.
11. These rules shall only be altered by the Annual General Meeting of the Club.

BRITISH EMPIRE v. UNITED STATES OF AMERICA. September 4th, 1920

By the Editor of "The Field."

No athletic meeting ever held in England up to that time had proved so striking and popular a success as the competition held between the United States and the British Empire at Queen's Club on September 4th, 1920. It was made possible by the return, through this country, of the American team after the conclusion of the Olympic Games in Antwerp. It was the first big affair of the kind organized by the Achilles Club, and Mr. P. J. Baker, Mr. Rudd and Mr. Milligan deserve the heartiest congratulations on the large share they took in the preliminary work. It is indeed difficult to understand how well the first two ran after all the labours they had faced both before the start and during the progress of the meeting. The crowd of spectators was the largest ever seen at Queen's. The cheering when Hatton overhauled Joie Ray in the four-mile relay, or when Driscoll made up 10 yards on Butler in the mile relay, was explosive, enthusiastic and thoroughly deserved. It was clear that the relay, known before but never properly carried out, was not only acceptable but permanent. Luckily, the loss of Charles Paddock to the American team made, on the day, no difference. Their victory in the 400-yards relay and their defeat in the half-mile relay would have remained the same had he been present. P. J. Baker, 16 years after his first prize, had run as well at Antwerp as he ever did in his life; but he was not quite up to two hard races on September 4th, and perhaps Milligan might

have taken his place with advantage in the two-mile relay. But, even as it was, his race with Larry Shields in the last leg of the four-mile relay was one of the finest things of the meeting, and next to it might be placed Edgar Mountain's splendid performance against Ray in the two-mile relay. Earl Thompson's hurdling was, of course, magnificent, as was the running of the United States in the two-mile team-race. The 110 metres of the hurdles is 120·3 yards, and the previous British record was 15 secs. dead, by F. Smithson, in the Olympic Games of 1908. For the Americans, both Sol Butler and R. Landon were some way off their true form; and though they had another winner ready for the long jump, it was Howard Baker's unexpected victory in the high jump which saved us from defeat and gave a dead heat as the highly diplomatic and apparently universally popular result of the whole meeting.

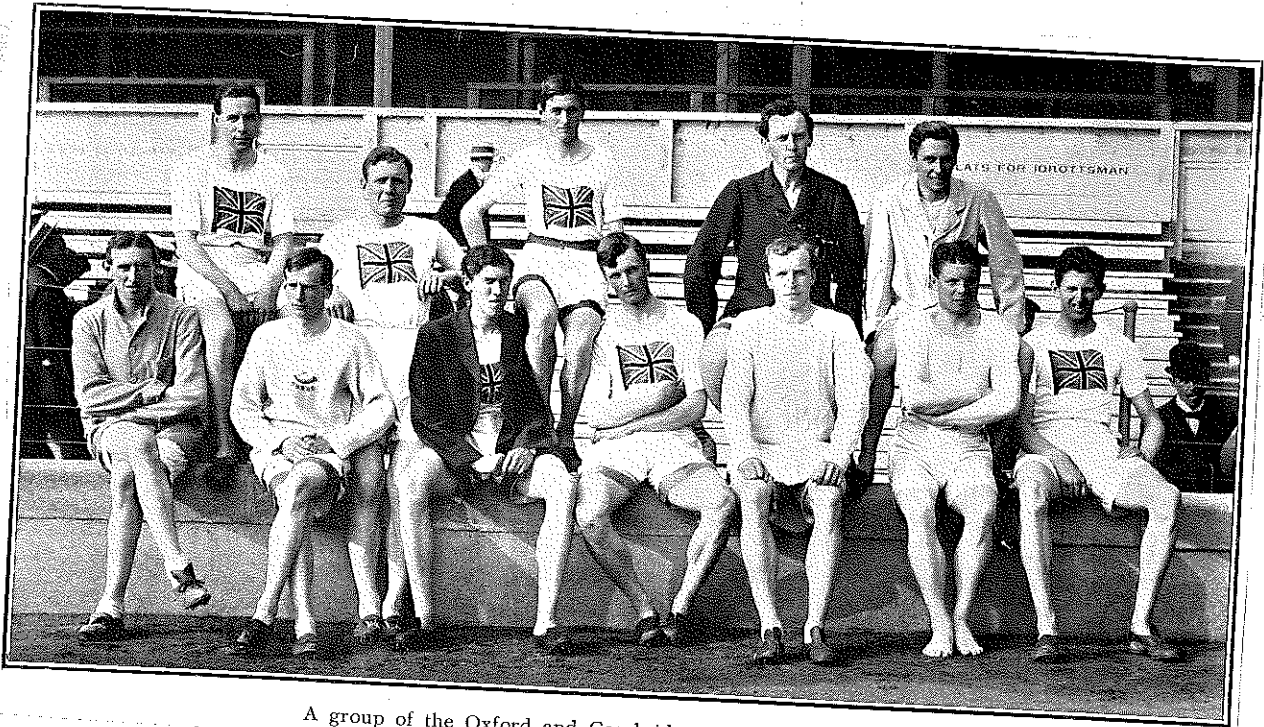
