ANNUAL REPORT

The season of 1958 was an eventful one, containing as it did The British Empire and Commonwealth Games in Cardiff, and The European Athletic Championships in Stockholm, in both of which members of the Club took part.

But to put first things first, the 'Varsity Sports, virtually the opening of the English track season, were held on Saturday, March 22nd, 1958, and resulted in an outstanding victory for Cambridge by 79 points to Oxford's 47. Oxford's record run of ten consecutive wins was thus halted. The Drake-Digby Cup for the best performance was awarded to J. R. A. Scott-Oldfield (Cambridge).

Good news comes from Cambridge where a new cinder track has been built off Milton Road. Many will look back with mostalgia on the great days at Henner's, but undoubtedly Cambridge athletes have to some extent been hampered by lack of permanent summer training facilities which the new track will supply. A pavilion has yet to be erected but the initial hurdles have been cleared.

A School Tour again took place in the summer, under the able direction of A. W. Selwyn, when Sherborne, Bryanston and Winchester were visited. No Foreign Tour was undertaken due to the pressure of other fixtures, but arrangements were set in train for a Tour to South Africa in March and April, 1959. After extensive negotiations by R. St. G. T. Harper on behalf of the Club, along with the British Amateur Athletic Board, this Tour had at the last moment to be abandoned due to the absolutely impractical demands from South Africa as regards dates and duration of stay.

Again during 1958 we were able to welcome a combined University Team from the United States of America, with Cornell and Pennsylvania visiting us. The Team stayed for a few days at both Oxford and Cambridge, and the Meeting took place at the White City on Saturday, June 14th, 1958, resulting in a victory for Oxford and Cambridge by 9 events to 6. We all greatly value these series of Meetings and it was good to meet again Bob Kane, in charge of the Team, and Lou Montgomery, the Cornell Track Coach, who has so often visited us. This fixture, once again, was made possible by the generosity of Sir William Carr, and the News of the World, our Sponsors.

A. R. Pinnington acted as Team Manager to the Club Teams taking part in the Trophy Meetings, and other open competitions.

Again the Club's representation suffered severely through injuries and other causes, and our performances in this type of competition, over the last few years, gives cause for concern. We wish A. R. Pinnington all success in his tour of duty in Canada and welcome his successor, H. R. H. Stinson.

The British Empire and Commonwealth Games took place in Cardiff, Wales, in July, 1958. Thirteen members of the Club took part.

Duncan (British Empire and Commonwealth Games Federation); R. St. G. T. Harper and R. P. D. Van Rossum (England's Team H.Q.); V. B. P. Powell and K. K. T. Mara, with the Nigerian and Fiji Teams respectively; our Chairman, H. M. Abrahams, A. R. Alston, R. G. Bannister, C. W. Brasher, A. R. and N. D. McWhirter, Vernon Morgan and many others.

The Games were an outstanding success, and the comradeship and understanding between the Teams of thirty-five Countries showed the ideals of International Sport in their highest form.

## Great Britain v. France

The Editor of Modern Athletics, by the Achilles Club, published by Oxford University Press, reports satisfactory sales. The Club, in this book, departed from its previous Coaching text-book, and selected members wrote on their own particular subject, each of which in one way or another is of importance to Athletics as a whole.

Each year, as will be known, two Achilles Medals are awarded—one for the best track performance, and the other for the best field event performance, by an Achilles member. For 1958 these were awarded as follows:—

Track—P. B. Hildreth ... 110 Metres Hurdles, 14·3 sec Field—J. Kitching ... ... High Jump, 6 ft. 4 in.

The Medals will be presented at the Annual General Meeting of the Club at the Park Lane Hotel on Saturday, May 9th, 1959.

Much has been happening in this Country as regards Sport and Athletics in particular. The stresses and strains of modern competition and training make great demands upon the time and energies of athletes, and also upon those Firms which employ them. Television and the Press "build up" some athletes to the same degree as film stars, but the athletes do not have a host of secretaries and advisors.

International Athletics is now a form of entertainment business, from which large "gates" are obtained, and with its cast composed of amateurs who are not obliged to perform. All this gives rise to problems and to the formation of the A.A.A. Athletes Advisory Committee and the International Athletes Club. In addition to all this, an independent "Inquiry into Sport" has been set-up under the Chairmanship of Sir John Wolfenden, Sir Arthur Porritt being one of the members; and this Committee will, it is hoped, make recommendations which, if carried into effect, will have far-reaching results on the overall sporting endeavours in this Country.

John Ford, after ten years as Honorary Treasurer, has resigned. Our thanks are extended to him for all he has done for the Club, and he has handed over the finances in an excellent state to his successor, Derek Steel. Our Chairman, H. M. Abrahams, has the affairs of the Club close to his heart, and our thanks are also given to Norris and Ross McWhirter, R. T. S. Macpherson, A. W. Selwyn and H. R. H. Stinson, who do so much for us.
